Rwanda is a springboard into the larger East African market: is part of the East African Community (EAC), which together has a population of approximately 170 million. Rwanda is also part of the Common Market for Eastern and Southern Africa (COMESA) Free Trade Area, with a combined population of 586 million.

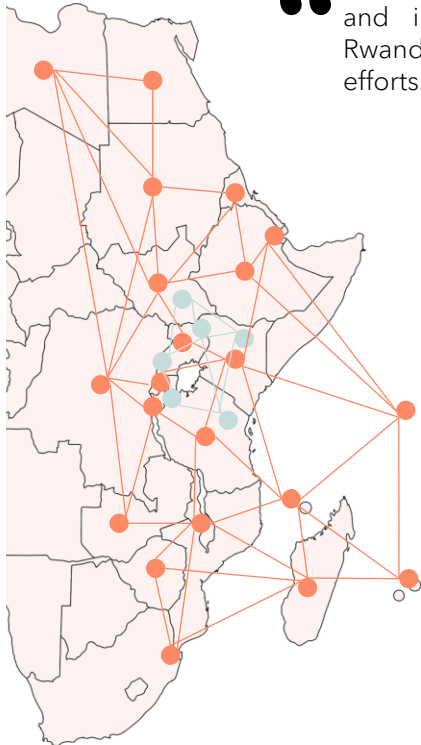

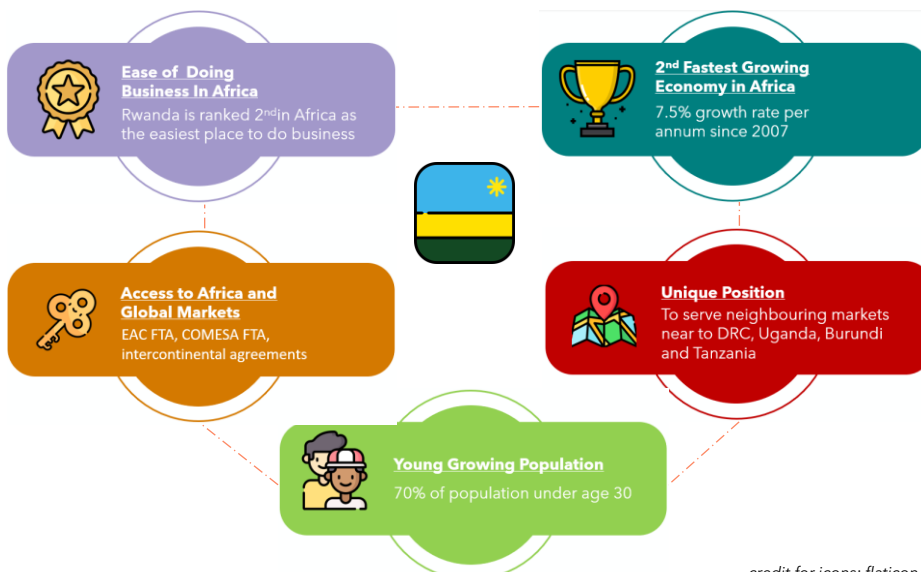
